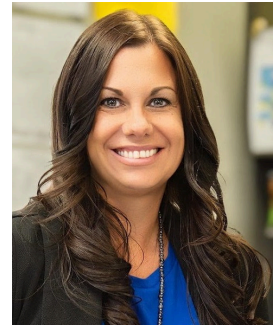

Principal's Message

Dear Wildcat Community,

As the leaves begin to change, so do the experiences and growth of our students. We're excited about all the wonderful learning opportunities planned for this school year. Our teachers and staff have been hard at work creating engaging lessons, organizing events, and ensuring our students feel safe and supported.



The monthly Character Trait assemblies have been modified this year. While these monthly character assemblies are designed to promote positive values and reinforce character education, there were some negative impacts or unintended consequences of these assemblies on our students. Therefore, our staff has adjusted these assemblies in the following way:

- These will now be quarterly assemblies taking place at the end of each marking period.
- No more than 2 students will be selected from each class.
- Parents will be notified of their child receiving an award in advance of the assemblies so they can attend. (Same as before.)
- Selected students will receive a certificate and reward at the assembly after a brief presentation.
- Here are the character themes for each marking period:

Quarter 4 - "Scholarship"

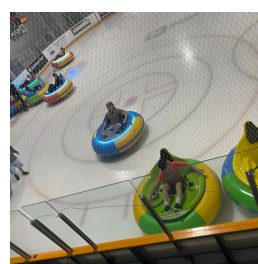

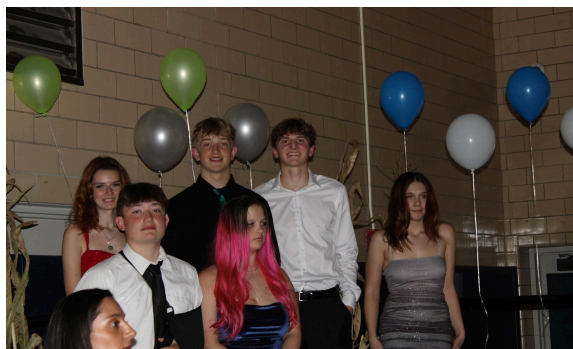
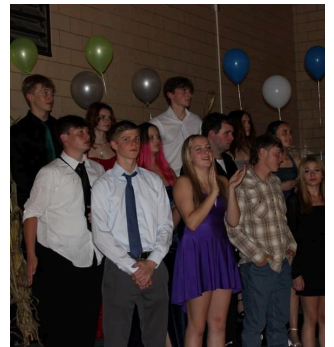
We encourage you to stay connected and involved as we navigate this exciting time of year, together. Your engagement makes a significant difference and enriches our school environment.

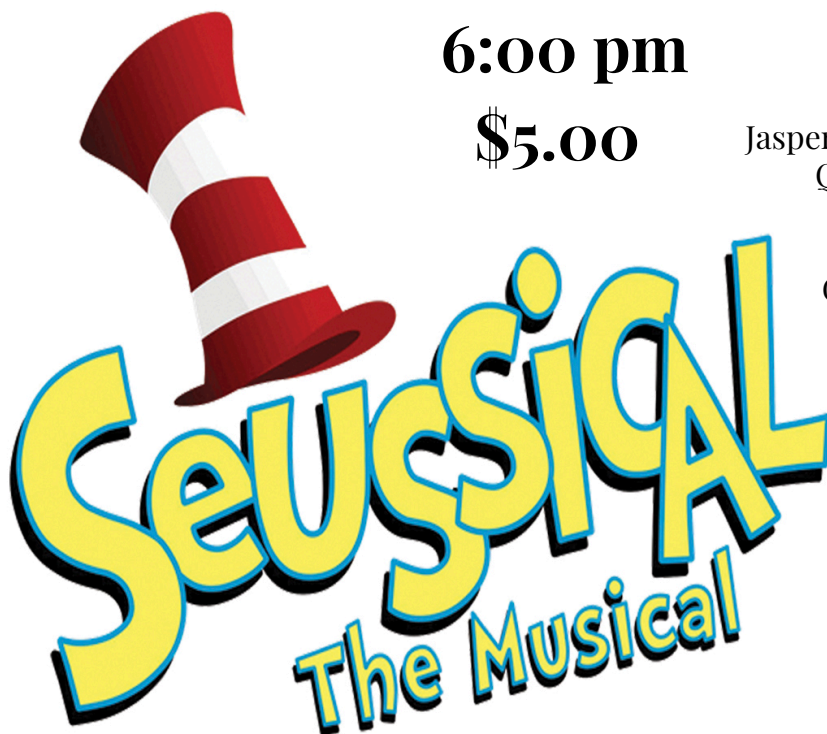

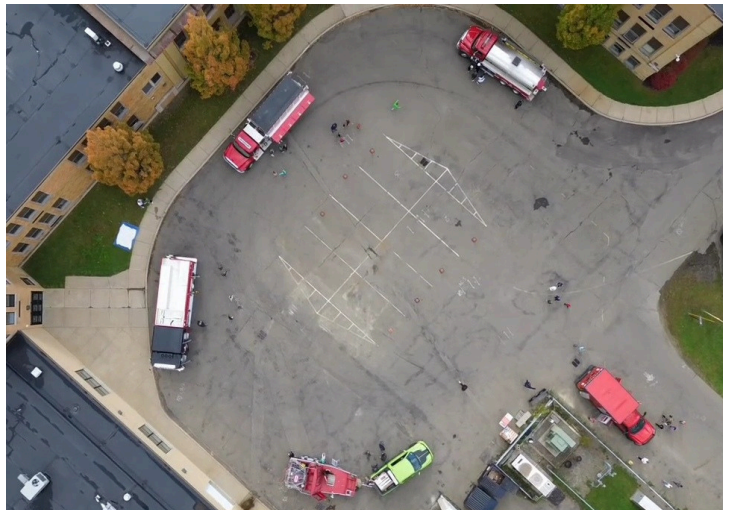
Mrs. Hanby's Class

The CSP varsity football team is off to a 4-2 start to the 2024 season, including a 3-0 league record. CSP is coming off of a 50-6 win against Lake Shore on Homecoming weekend, and with a win on Saturday, 10/19 against Wilson, the Wolfpack will clinch their 4th league championship in the past 7 seasons. Currently ranked #2 in New York State Class D, the Wolfpack is primed for another playoff run after losing in the state semifinals last fall. Sherman athletes on the varsity Wolfpack include Carson Pinzok, Troy Chambers, Mason Moore, and Mary Fuller.

Cross Country

As of October 11, the CSP Wolfpack Varsity Girls are 11-1 with one league meet remaining against Falconer, Olean, and Dunkirk. The team has participated in three invitationals, with a fourth on October 12 in Alden. The team finished 1st out of 14 at the Knox Invitational, 6th out of 25 at the Queensbury Invitational, and 5th out of 33 at the McQuaid Invitational. The top 50 finishers at McQuaid from CSP include Solki Martin-Lacayo (20), Grace Cooke (29), and Tess Flikkema (38). There were 341+ runners in the race. Other top runners include Caitlyn Kriner, Baya Oehlbeck, Abby Malecki, Bria Palmatier, and Brooke Warner.

As of October 11, the CSP Wolfpack Varsity Boys are 9-3 with one league meet remaining against Falconer, Olean, and Dunkirk. The team has participated in four invitationals, with a fifth on October 12 in Alden. The team finished 6th out of 17 at the Knox Invitational, 19th out of 30 at the Queensbury Invitational, 6th out of 11 at the Red Dragon Invitational, and 10th out of 56 at the McQuaid Invitational. The top 50 finishers at McQuaid from CSP include Finn Fadale (46). There were 440+ runners in the race. Other top finishers this season include Flynn Fadale, Max Guzman, Ely Smith, Kody Howard, and Chris Phelps, a recent 7th-grade move-up.

The CSP Boys and Girls Modified Teams have significantly improved over the season. The modified boys and girls have competed in various league meets (unscored) and two invitationals, with one league meet remaining against Falconer, Olean, and Dunkirk. The final invitational is on October 12 in Alden. At invitationals, the boys finished 1st out of 5 at the Red Dragon Invitational and 5th out of 21 at the McQuaid Invitational. The top 50 finishers from CSP include Chris Phelps (2), Brody Ellis (45), and Ethan Taylor (49). There were 349+ runners in the race. At invitationals, the girls have been incomplete but producing good times.

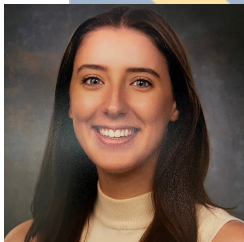
Welcome to SCS
