

Third Grade's Science Unit for the month of May was The Life Cycle of Butterflies. It gave students the opportunity to investigate the life cycle of the Painted Lady Butterfly. Within the month, third graders saw their caterpillars arrive as small larvae, they watched them crawl, suspend themselves upside down, spin silk, eat, eliminate waste, and molt. They then witnessed the transformation from caterpillar to chrysalis. Students saw the characteristic J-shape the caterpillar assumed as it suspended itself from the top of its cup in preparation for the transformation. They noted all of these stages as observations in their Science Journals. Then when the adult butterflies emerged from the chrysalises, students got a chance to hold them before they took off in flight to continue the life cycle!




