First Grade

Students worked hard on writing facts about apples and making a display in the hallway! To start off the year we have had a strong focus on narratives and poetry in ELA. We spent some time learning about fire safety as well as emergencies in the community or at home. Math class has been filled with place value as well as addition and subtraction in our new math books. The kids are loving the new math curriculum that 2nd grade is piloting. In science we started learning about fall and the science behind it and plan to learn more about the life cycle of pumpkins leading up to Halloween.

Both third grade classes enjoyed learning about the country of Mexico, which was their first unit in their Communities Around the World Social Studies Curriculum. To celebrate the end of the unit, the classes had a Fiesta! Each student made several crafts, such as sombreros, maracas & pinatas. They watched a cooking demonstration of Mrs. Solinger making homemade guacamole and salsa, as well as trying it with nacho chips and cheese. It was a fun afternoon had by all!











Fourth Grade

Photos: As part of the Grandparent's Day parade, fourth graders "believe in their selfie" by making unique face frames. Fourth graders studied crayfish structures to determine how they grow and survive. After several weeks in the classroom, the crayfish were released into the creek. How many seeds were in this pumpkin? Fourth graders were eager to participate in this math/science activity. These seeds tasted pretty good too! Students work cooperatively to build stable structures in this 4th grade STEM activity.













Fifth Grade

Students worked in small groups to study an ancient cultural group. Then they completed a gallery walk to learn from their peers' hard work.

Fifth grade students enjoyed learning about fire safety and prevention stations.











Mr. Burns' Science class started the year off working on communication and collaboration while building K-nex cars. A beautiful Grandparents' Day kicked off the school year.

Sixth Grade

The 6th Grade Science students began the year taking on the role of student researchers. They learned that over 100 trillion micro-organisms live on and in the human body. Students utilized microscopes to observe microscopic objects and classified them as organic or inorganic. Currently, they have taken on new roles as medical students. They are researching the human body systems to try and diagnose a student who has a medical issue. They made a body systems model to assist them in understanding how the body utilizes different molecules to help stay healthy.



Cell Phone Case- Drawing & Painting


Marissa Powell
